LAST TIME OUT: The Cyclones dropped their second-straight defeat in a 7-1 loss to the Tourists. Asheville scored six runs in the top of the first on a grand slam from SS **Ryan Johnson** and a two-run double by 2B **Jeron Williams**. 3B **Austin Deming** reached base four times on two singles and two walks. DH **Nolan McLean** provided Brooklyn's only run on a solo home run in the seventh. RF **Ryan Clifford** and 1B **Nick Lorusso** added doubles, while LF **Omar De Los Santos** stole a pair of bases. RHP **Douglas Orellana** tossed 4.0 innings of shutout relief, striking out six.

ROSTER MOVES: Brooklyn made a series of roster moves before Saturday's doubleheader. RHP **Alan Perdomo** was transferred from Single-A St. Lucie, while OF **Joe Suozzi** was reinstated from the Development List and transferred from Double-A Binghamton. In corresponding moves, OF **Karell Paz** and INF **D'Andre Smith** were placed on the 7-day injured list. Perdomo was selected by the New York Mets from the Colorado Rockies organization in the minor league phase of the 2023 Rule V Draft. Over two appearances in St. Lucie, the 22-year-old allowed just one run on four hits over 3.1 innings. Suozzi has not appeared in 2024 and split 2023 between Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Triple-A Syracuse. The 27-year-old has appeared in 127 games for the Clones since 2021 and holds a .230/.320/.372 mark with a .692 OPS, nine home runs, and 49 RBI.

DOUBLE DARE: Brooklyn will play its first doubleheader of the 2024 season on Saturday against Asheville. The Cyclones struggled mightily in twinbills during the 2023 season, posting an 0-4-2 mark with a total 2-10 record. Since moving to the full-season level in 2021, Brooklyn is 4-9-10 in doubleheaders and 18-28 overall (.391). Saturday marks the Clones first double dip since last August 31's split at Greenville. LHP **Felipe De La Cruz** started game one of that contest, as well, tossing a complete game in Brooklyn's 1-0 defeat. The Cyclones captured the nightcap, 7-4. The doubleheader will be the Cyclones' first against the Tourists.

DE RECORD SETTER: OF **Omar De Los Santos** stole a pair of bases on Friday night and broke INF **Walter Rasquin's** (32) franchise single-season stolen base record (37) in 2023. The 24-year-old entered as a pinch-runner and caught Hudson Valley napping to steal second base on July 21, 2023, to set the mark. Entering Saturday, De Los Santos is second on the Cyclones' all-time stolen base list (42). He is six steals shy of matching UTL **Jaylen Palmer's** (48) all-time record. Since the start of 2022, De Los Santos is eighth across the Minors for swipes (112).

HOME OPENER: The Brooklyn Cyclones opened up their 66-game home schedule on Tuesday evening vs. Asheville with a 3-0 win. The shutout marked the first for Brooklyn in a home opener since a 3-0 victory in 11 years. The Cyclones last blanked an opponent in their home debut on June 20, 2013, vs. Aberdeen. RHP **John Gant** (5.0 IP), RHP **Tim Peterson** (2.2), and LHP **John Mincone** (1) combined for the win. The Clones are now 17-5 all-time in their first home game of the season.

ZEIG ZAG: After being limited to just 10 inning of work in 2023 due to injuries, RHP **Calvin Ziegler** flourished in his High-A and Cyclones' debut. The 21-year-old tied a career-high with nine strikeouts and punched out eight straight hitters from one out in the 1st until the last batter of the 3rd. Ziegler became just the fifth Brooklyn pitcher to strike out 9 or more hitters in 4.0 or fewer innings since 2005. LHP **Blade Tidwell** accomplished the feat last June 11 vs. Greenville, whiffing 10 in 4.0 frames. LHP **Andrew Edwards** (8/30/19), LHP **Martin Anderson** (7/7/17), and RHP **Dawrin Frias** (7/31/13) are the others.

GRAB SOME PINE: RHPs **Calvin Ziegler**, **Josh Hejka**, **Dakota Hawkins**, and **Joshua Cornielli** combined to strike out 18 Wilmington hitters over 9.2 innings in Sunday's loss. The 18 strikeouts by Cyclones pitching marked the most for the franchise in a single game since July 23, 2016, vs. Aberdeen. RHP **Justin Dunn** (5), LHP **Kyle Regnault** (2), and RHP **Nabil Crismatt** (1) combined to whiff 18 IronBirds over 9.0 innings in a 7-2 win. The single-game franchise mark for team strikeouts is 22 set in a 20-inning, 3-2 loss vs. Staten Island on June 17, 2016.

2023 IN REVIEW: Brooklyn claimed a share of the North Division Second Half crown in the South Atlantic League, but ceded the final playoff spot to the Jersey Shore BlueClaws on a head-to-head tiebreaker. Needing a win on the final day of the regular season to clinch a playoff spot, the

vs. ASHEVILLE: Brooklyn opens the 2024 home schedule against the Astros' High-A affiliate. The series marks the Tourists first ever visit to Coney Island and Maimonides Park. Asheville possess six of Houston's top 30 prospects per MLB Pipeline: OF **Luis Báez** (2), SS **Brice Matthews** (4), RHP **Jake Bloss** (11), RHP **Andrew Taylor** (17), LHP **Trey Dombroski** (22), OF **Cam Fisher** (24). In 14 all-time meetings, 11 of which have been played at McCormick Field, the Cyclones lead the series, 7-7. Brooklyn won 4-of-6 last August in Asheville.

Clones dropped a 6-2 contest to Wilmington. Jersey Shore would outlast the Hudson Valley Renegades, 10-9, in 11 innings to secure the seat. After a 28-37 first-half record, the Cyclones composed a 38-28 mark in the second half to finish the season over .500 at 66-65.

YOUTH IS SERVED: **Gilbert Gómez** takes over as manager of the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2024. At 32 years of age, the Santo Domingo, D.R. native is the youngest skipper in franchise history. After leading Single-A St. Lucie last summer, Gómez served as manager of Tigres del Licey in the Dominican Winter League (LIDOM). Became the youngest manager to win a championship in LIDOM history and the second-youngest manager to win a game in Caribbean Series history. Gómez's younger brother, **Dariel**, played at Double-A Binghamton in the Mets' organization last summer and is currently with the Charleston Dirty Birds of the MLB Partner Atlantic League. Older brother, **José**, is a scout for the Tampa Bay Rays and general manager for LIDOM's Leones del Escogido. Older brother, **Héctor**, is a well-known baseball reporter. Gómez also played seven years in New York's farm system, posting a .662 OPS in 537 games.

FAMILIAR FACES: Out of the 30 players on the Cyclones' preliminary roster, 16 of them have previous experience playing on Coney Island. **Jeffrey Colón**, **Joshua Cornielli**, **Felipe De La Cruz**, **Jordan Geber**, **Josh Hejka**, **Joey Lancellotti**, and **Jordany Ventura** return to the bump, while **Drake Osborn** and **Christian Pregent** are holdovers behind the dish. **Ryan Clifford**, **Mateo Gil**, **William Lugo**, **D'Andre Smith**, and **Nolan Tilen** are back in the infield, as **Stanley Consuegra** and **Omar De Los Santos** are set to roam the outfield.

GENIUNE DRAFT: Seven members of last summer's New York Mets' draft class will open the 2024 season with the Cyclones. Pregent returns to the roster, while second-round selection RHP **Brandon Sproat** and third-round pick two-way player **Nolan McLean** are scheduled to make their High-A debuts. RHP **Noah Hall** (7th), INF **Nick Lorusso** (9th), RHP **Ben Simon** (13th), and RHP **Justin Lawson** (15th) round out the group. RHP **Dakota Hawkins**, who signed as an undrafted free agent, will also start the season in Brooklyn.

KING STANLEY: On the final day of the 2023 regular season, OF **Stanley Consuegra** broke a tie with C **Francisco Álvarez** for Brooklyn's single-season home run record (23). Consuegra (28) also surpassed Álvarez (22) for the franchise record in career home runs on August 23 at Asheville. He and Álvarez are the only two players in franchise history to record a 20-plus home run season. The 23-year-old also broke the franchise's single-season record for extra-base hits (42) and tied the mark for RBI (63) set by **Ronny Mauricio** in 2021. Consuegra also holds the Clones all-time record for RBI (90) and extra-base knocks (62).

AMAZIN' STARTS HERE: The Brooklyn Cyclones have several Top 30 prospects according to *Baseball America* and MLB Pipeline. The Clones have four of the Top 30 per BA: **Ryan Clifford** (No. 5), **Brandon Sproat** (11), **Nolan McLean** (15), and **Calvin Ziegler** (29). Clifford (4), Sproat (13), McLean (19), and Ziegler (22) all appear on MLB's list, as well. MLB Pipeline also considers Clifford the 93rd-best farmhand in all of baseball. Among MLB Pipeline's list of Top 30 Mets prospects, 16 have experience playing with the Cyclones, including six of the top 10: INF **Jett Williams** (1), Clifford (4), RHP **Christian Scott** (5), INF **Ronny Mauricio** (6), C **Kevin Parada** (9), and RHP **Blade Tidwell** (10).

LAST TIME OUT: Took a no-decision in his first start of the season last Saturday at Wilmington...Did not allow a run on one hit over 4.0 innings...Walked one and struck out two...Tossed 59 pitches and 40 strikes (67.8%)...Relieved by RHP **Jordan Geber** to start the bottom of the fifth with Brooklyn leading, 2-0...Blue Rocks scored two in the sixth to tie and won, 4-2, in the bottom of the ninth on a walk-off, two-run home run by LF **Jared McKenzie**.

PROSPECT RADAR: After a stellar 2023 season, De La Cruz was deemed the New York Mets' No. 39 prospect entering the 2024 campaign by *Baseball America*.

WELCOME TO BROOKLYN: The 22-year-old joined the Cyclones from Single-A St. Lucie last year on August 22 and thrived over three starts...De La Cruz accumulated a 2-1 record with a 2.45 ERA (5 ER in 17.0 IP) with five walks and 17 strikeouts...The southpaw hurled quality starts in two of his three starts, including going all 6.0 innings in the lid-lifter of a doubleheader on August 31 at Greenville...After allowing a leadoff home run, De La Cruz retired 18 of the final 19 batters he faced, including sitting the last 11 down in order...The southpaw was credited with a complete game, the first for a Brooklyn pitcher since RHP **José Butto** accomplished the feat, tossing 6.0 innings in a 7-inning loss at Aberdeen in Game 1 of a twinbill on June 30, 2021...After making his SAL debut on August 23 at Asheville, De La Cruz ranked third in the circuit in WHIP (0.94), fifth in batting average against (.183), and sixth in ERA (2.65).

FELIPE FINISHES WITH A FLOURISH: De La Cruz racked up the strikeouts in bunches over his final month at Single-A...Over his final 8 appearances (7 starts), De La Cruz paced the Florida State League and all Single-A players in strikeouts (57)...Struck out 8 more batters than Clearwater's LHP **Danny Wilkinson** (49) who was second...De La Cruz went 1-2 with a 4.33 ERA (17 ER in 35.1 IP) with 18 walks (11.4 BB%) and 57 strikeouts (36.1%).

FLORIDA STATE FELIPE: De La Cruz was among the best strikeout artists in the Florida State League in 2023... Among FSL pitchers with 90.0 or more innings pitched, the 22-year-old led the circuit in strikeout rate (28.7%)...The southpaw also led the league in strikeouts-per-9 innings (11.36) and swinging strike rate (15.5%), while ranking 2nd in xFIP (3.68)...In 21 appearances (19 starts) with St. Lucie, De La Cruz was 3-6 with a 4.68 ERA (47 ER in 90.1 IP), 41 walks, and 114 strikeouts.

GOING TO GLENDALE: Following the 2023 regular season, Geber was chosen to represent the New York Mets as a member of the Glendale Desert Dogs in the prestigious Arizona Fall League...In five starts, the 24-year-old compiled a 1-2 record with a 6.00 ERA (12 ER in 18.0 IP), walking only three and striking out 15...Geber played alongside former Cyclones RHP **Nolan Clenney**, RHP **Brendan Hardy**, INF **Rowdey Jordan**, RHP **Trey McLoughlin**, C **Kevin Parada**, INF **JT Schwartz**, and INF **D'Andre Smith**.

2023: Started the season with the Brooklyn Cyclones before landing on the 7-day injured list on May 14...Joined the Florida Complex League Mets on a rehab assignment on July 19...Made three appearances (two starts), allowing four runs on eight hits in 5.1 innings...Rehab transferred to Single-A St. Lucie on August 6...Went 0-1 with a 13.50 ERA (8 ER in 5.1 IP) in two outings (one start)...Reinstated from the IL on August 14...In seven appearances (three starts), Geber collected a 3-1 mark with a 4.59 ERA (17 ER in 33.1 IP) with Brooklyn...Transferred to Double-A Binghamton for the remainder of the season August 31...Did not allow a run on 14 hits over 18.0 innings in three games (one start) with the Rumble Ponies.

MOUNT HOKIE: Geber split his college career between Mount St. Mary's University (Emmitsburg, Md.)...Spent four seasons with the Mountaineers...Named to the All-Northeast Conference First Team as a reliever in 2021...Tallied a 2-3 clip with a 3.88 ERA (26 ER in 60.1 IP) with 68 K's in 11 outings (10 starts)...Transferred to Virginia Tech for his graduate season in 2022...Accrued a 1-2 record with a 5.40 ERA (21 ER in 35.0 IP) and 40 whiffs in 16 appearances (seven starts) for the Hokies.

FIRST DRAFT: Geber became one of the first two players to sign with a Major League franchise straightout of the brand new MLB Draft League in 2022...The 23-year-old was the first member of the Keys to sign with a parent club since the league formed prior to the 2021 season...Former Cyclones' RHP **Joe Joe Rodríguez** was the first MLB Draft Leaguer to sign.
